

BC (Before Christ) or BCE (Before Common Era) c. circa A.D. Anno Domini ("in the year of the Lord")

c. o – Birth of Jesus Christ

c. 36 A.D. or C.E. – Death of Jesus Christ

42 – St. Peter reaches Rome (establishment of the "Early Church")

48 – 95 – New Testament is written

1054 – Split between Eastern (Orthodox) and Western (Roman) churches

1517 – Rev. Dr. Martin Luther posts his 95 thesis on a church door in Wittenberg, Germany, protesting certain practices of the (Roman) Church

1536 – John Calvin (born in France) begins organizing a reformation in Geneva this will come to be known as the Reformation

1549 – Thomas Cranmer completes *The Book of Common Prayer*, the official service book of the Church of England (Anglican Church, as it is known in Canada)

1550 – Beginning of Congregationalist Church (Congregationalist style of church government as opposed to Presbyterian or Episcopal style of church government)

1556 – Genevan Book of Order completed by John Calvin in Geneva

1560 – Beginning of the Church of Scotland – John Knox completes *Book of Discipline* (Book regulating Ecclesiastical – or Church –Order) some of which is not officially agreed upon by the Church of Scotland

1562 – General Assembly of Church of Scotland accepts Book of Common Order (which is Calvin's Genevan Book of Order of 1556)

1564 – A new and enlarged edition of The Book of Common Order is completed; it is the service book for the Church of Scotland – its chief author is John Knox, who was greatly influenced by John Calvin

1578 – Second Book of Discipline written by Andrew Melville is considerably more well received by the Church of Scotland than was Knox's first edition

Early 1600s – Settlers reach Canada

1609 – John Smythe begins what came to be known as the Baptist Church



1638 – Church of Scotland is established on a Presbyterian basis (use of Presbyterian model of church government; for example the office of Bishop is abolished)

1753 – St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church in Lunenburg Nova Scotia is founded, it is the oldest Presbyterian congregation in Canada

1797 – John Wesley begins what comes to be known as Methodism

1816 – Christian Reformed Church in Holland is founded (disestablished in 1848)

1833 – What would eventually come to be known as St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church in Whitby is started by the Rev. Robert Thornton

1867 - The Commonwealth of Canada is formed

1875 – The Presbyterian Church in Canada is formed

– founding of The World Alliance of Reformed and Presbyterian Churches Late 1800s, early 1900s – Pentecostalism and churches so called begin to appear in England and the USA

1922 – 1938 – 1964 – Editions of *The Book of Common Order* of the Presbyterian Church in Canada are published; in 1991 a new edition is published which is renamed *The Book of Common Worship*

1925 – The United Church of Canada is formed; it includes all Congregationalist churches in Canada, all Methodist churches in Canada and approximately 66% of churches of the Presbyterian Church in Canada; the remaining 34% of Presbyterian churches that do not join The United Church of Canada remain The Presbyterian Church in Canada

1970 – The World Alliance of Reformed Churches (WARC) is founded; The Presbyterian Church in Canada is a member; in 2010 WARC and The Reformed Ecumenical Council merge to form The World Communion of Reformed Churches (WCRC)
